Replica Instruments

Note:

Under Section 272(1) of the Duties Act 1997 the duty chargeable on a replica is:

- \$50 for instruments first executed on or before 31 January 2024, or
- \$100 for instruments first executed on or after 1 February 2024, or
- the same amount as the duty payable on the instrument the replica is intended to replace, whichever is the lesser.

The relevant duty should be paid at the time the replica instrument is lodged for stamping

- Under the Taxation Administration Act 1996, it is an offence to knowingly give false or misleading information, or omit information.
- You may also be liable to interest and/or penalty tax
